The Brentwood Energy & Efficiency Advisory Committee (BEEAC) is seeking interested applicants to fill 2 positions for an alternate member role on the Committee.

BEEAC PURPOSE: To advise the Town of Brentwood Select Board and other committees and boards on best practices related to energy and efficiency.

BEEAC MISSION:

Research potential remedies for the impacts high electricity and energy costs are having on residents, businesses, and town offices

Research the recent decision of the NH Public Utilities Commission (PUC) to approve the Community Power rules to determine potential benefits to the Town

Conduct research on the Community Power Coalition of NH to determine the pros and cons of membership

Review methods to reduce town energy consumption (electric, natural gas, fuel consumption, fossil fuel consumption)

Collect educational materials regarding ways to save money on electric and energy bills, reducing electricity usage, and submitting those materials to the Selectboard for approval and consideration for use on the town website and social media page

Research and education on various tax incentives available to residents that involve alternative energies for home/business

Review any available state and federal programs and grants to provide for the promotion of alternative energy

Evaluation of annual energy-related legislation being proposed in the state legislature and report to the Selectboard on implications for the Town and its residents

Periodic updates to the Town and Selectboard regarding energy related programs, initiatives available grants, etc.

MEMBERSHIP: Seven (7) residents interested in energy and environment issues.

Interested applicants should: have an interest in energy issues; attend monthly meetings; exhibit a willingness and ability to actively give time and energy to the Committee's work and projects.

Regional Associations Committee

The Regional Associations Committee seeks applicants for two (2) members and one (1) alternate position.

The Regional Associations Committee (RAC) was established in June, 2019 by the Select Board and charged with establishing an application and review process for regional associations (charities) that provide direct services to Brentwood residents and seek funding from the Town of Brentwood. Funding decisions are made for the budget year following the close of the application period.

The Regional Associations Committee is made up of five (5) voting members, serving three-year staggered terms, plus one (1) alternate appointed for a three-year term. The Committee meets to review requests for funding following the close of the application period that runs from Labor Day through October 30. If needed, the Town's Welfare Officer may be consulted about funding priorities. To prevent any appearance of a conflict of interest, Committee members may not vote to approve funding to an organization for which they serve on the Board, or with which they have a direct relationship as a client or employee. The Committee's recommendations for funding are presented for approval to the Select Board, and applicants are notified of the decisions by April 15, after the Town's budget is approved at Town Meeting.

Qualifications: Applicants must be a U.S. citizen, a Brentwood resident, and be over 18 years of age. They must exhibit a willingness and interest to give time to the work of the Committee and an ability to collaborate with others. An understanding of, or background in, non-profits and fundraising would be an asset.

Linda R. Garey Statement of Interest:
Alternate Member to the Town of Brentwood Trustees of the Trust Funds Board

I am interested in becoming an alternate member to the Trustees of the Trust Funds Board. Our family has lived in Brentwood since 2009, and I previously served on the SCS School Board for a three year term, followed by a 3 year term as the Brentwood representative to the Coop School Board. I then took a hiatus from public service when I returned to work full-time in 2014 until my retirement; it is my full-time work in those intervening years that is most relevant to this application.

My background is as an attorney. My career over the years has been varied, but my most recent experience was as a Trust & Estate attorney at McLane Middleton, the largest law firm in NH, where I represented individuals, families and charitable institutions. I assisted clients with all of their estate planning needs, and many clients had specific charitable intentions, sometimes to be met while they were still living and other times to be stated within their estate plan. I worked closely with these clients to be sure they clearly expressed their charitable (donor) intent.

In addition, usually on behalf of large charitable institutions in the State of New Hampshire, I worked closely with the Charitable Trust Unit in NH to insure that donor intent continued to met, even when the donor was no longer living. I am very familiar with how important it is to try to align donor intent with the use of the funds, and options that may be available when donor intent (say from a donation made decades ago) is no longer practical or feasible. But mostly, I have a deep understanding to the fiduciary responsibility that a recipient of those donated funds has; a duty to achieve the donor's stated wishes as closely as possible.

During my career, I have reviewed and analyzed numerous federal and state statutes, and advised clients regarding the meaning and interpretation of the statutes. As an attorney, I also assisted institutional clients with developing and revising investment policies for the management of charitable funds. It is critical that those who hold charitable funds be held to the highest standards, and understand their legal obligations.

Also, during my 6-year tenure on the school boards, I became familiar with the importance, use and expenditure of capital reserve funds. Each Trustee serving on the Trustees of the Trust Funds Board has a critical role in administering the funds appropriately. I would appreciate the opportunity to contribute to our town by serving as an Alternate on to the Trustees of the Trust Funds.

I have been actively involved in many aspects of the Commission since rejoining. I feel I have the experience and knowledge to help the commission be successful. Between my experience on the commission and with SELTNH, I have seen over 100 conservation easement transactions and feel I can help achieve positive outcomes with town residents to conserve their land.

I feel it is critical for the members of the town boards and commissions to be actively involved and take on tasks outside the meetings since there is so much to do and it can't all fall on the shoulders of the Chair or a couple people. I feel everyone needs to participate. Here are some of the things I have done towards that end.

I worked as part of a small group to update the Brentwood Conservation Manual by meeting with members and Glenn Greenwood.

I have been a vocal proponent to re-establishing the Open Space Subcommittee and volunteered to be a member of the Open Space Committee. My interest in participating on this subcommittee is to formalize a priority list and help proactively reach out to landowners with the goal of accelerating the pace of conservation using the Open Space Bond and grants.

I also have started an educational resource program whereby we are bringing in experts from partner organizations and other experts to both the Conservation Commission and Planning Board. To date, I have arranged for the Executive Director of the New Hampshire Association of Conservation Commissions (NHACC) to attend a Conservation meeting, as well as a zoom presentation from a data scientist from The Nature Conservancy to explain their goals and explain the Coastal Watershed Conservation Plan. I have the Director of Conservation from the Society for the Protection of NH Forests (SPNHF) lined up for the August meeting. I have also worked together with the Planning Board to have Glenn Greenwood do a presentation on wetlands and wetland regulations and have an engineer lined up for later this month to present on stormwater management.

I would welcome the opportunity to be a full voting member on the Conservation Commission and help the Town achieve its conservation goals. Thank you.

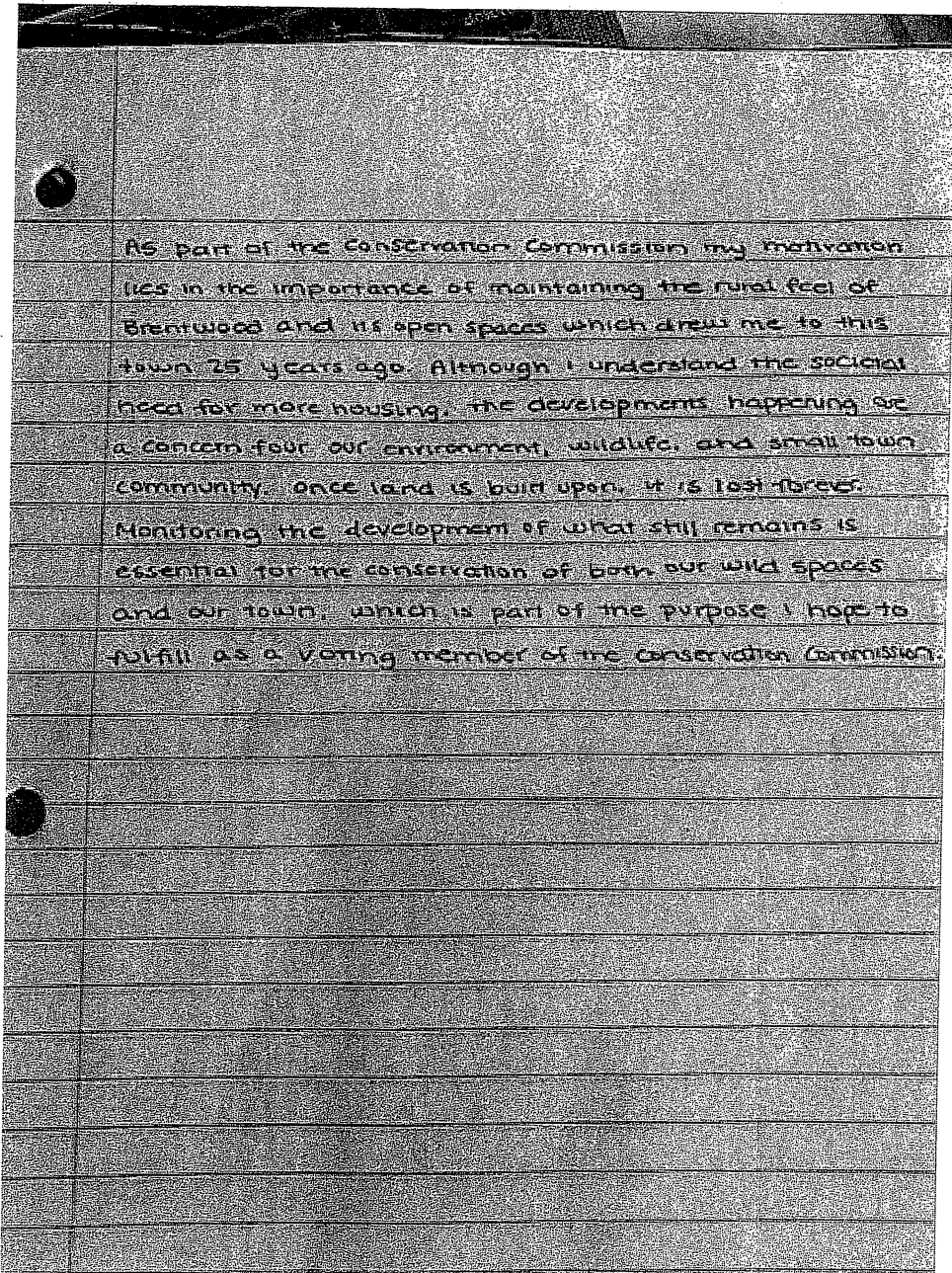

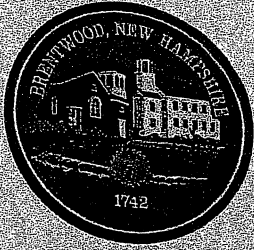
